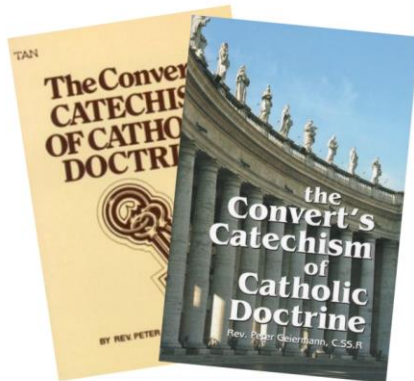

Here's how the Catholic Church fulfills the prophecy of **Daniel 7:25**, that it would think to change God's times and laws. There's only one commandment that deals with time, it's the Sabbath commandment, which commands us to "Remember" a specific period of time for worshipping God. Now notice what **Rev. Peter Geiermann**, says in the "Convert's Catechism of Catholic Doctrine" p.50

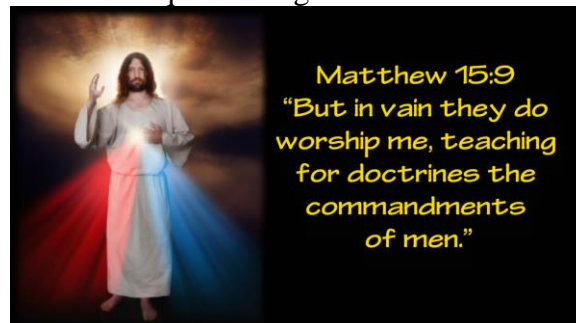
Q. Which is the Sabbath day?
A. Saturday is the Sabbath day.

Q. Why do we observe Sunday instead of Saturday?
A. We observe Sunday instead of Saturday because the Catholic Church transferred the solemnity from Saturday to Sunday."

Notice: God did NOT change the day, the Catholic Church has changed it!

Listen to what **Priest Brady** said in an address, **reported in the Elizabeth, NJ 'News' on March 18, 1903**. "It is well to remind the Presbyterians, Baptists, Methodists, and all other Christians, that the Bible does not support them anywhere in their observance of Sunday. Sunday is an institution of the Roman Catholic Church, and those who observe the day observe a commandment of the Catholic Church."

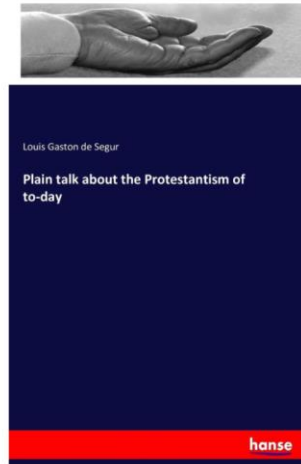
The words Jesus spoke in **Matthew 15:9** are quite fitting here.



Matthew 15:9
"But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men."

Albert Smith, Chancellor of the Archdioceses of Baltimore, replying for the Cardinal, in a letter dated February 10, 1920 said, "If Protestants would follow the Bible, they would worship God on the Sabbath Day. In keeping the Sunday they are following a law of the Catholic Church."

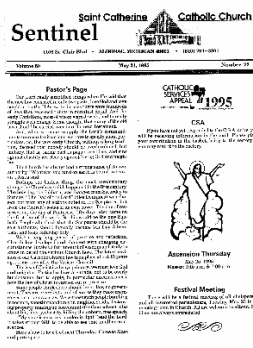
Here's a quote from **"Monsignor Louis Segur, in 'Plain Talk about the Protestantism of Today', p. 213.**

"The observance of Sunday by the Protestants is homage they pay, in spite of themselves, to the authority of the [Catholic] Church."

In other words, no matter what denomination you are, if you keep Sunday, you are giving your allegiance to the authority of the Catholic Church, instead of giving your allegiance to God.

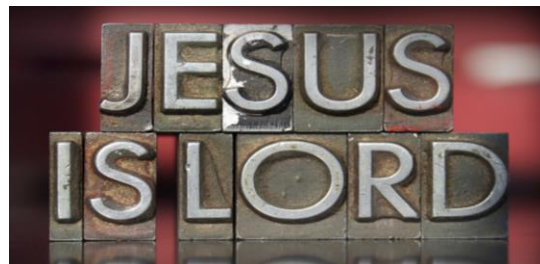


"Perhaps the boldest thing, the most revolutionary change the Church ever did, happened in the first century. The holy day, the Sabbath, was changed from Saturday to Sunday. "The Day of the Lord" was chosen, not from any directions noted in the Scriptures, but from the Church's sense of its own power. .. People who think that the Scriptures should be the sole authority, should logically become 7th Day Adventists, and keep Saturday holy."

Do you want to keep Sunday and pay homage to the Catholic Church, or do you want to follow God and Remember the Sabbath day as He commanded?

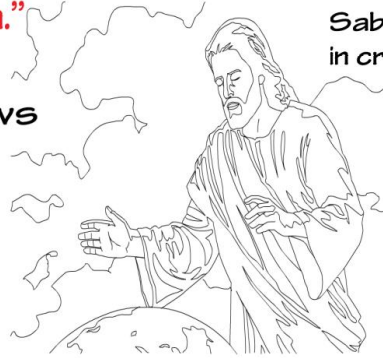

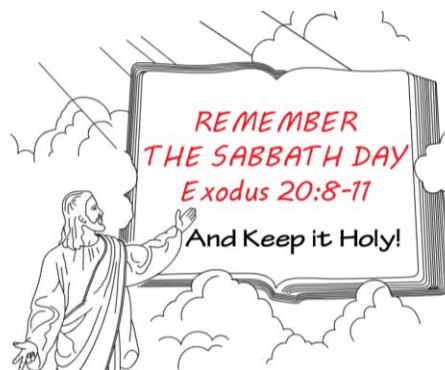
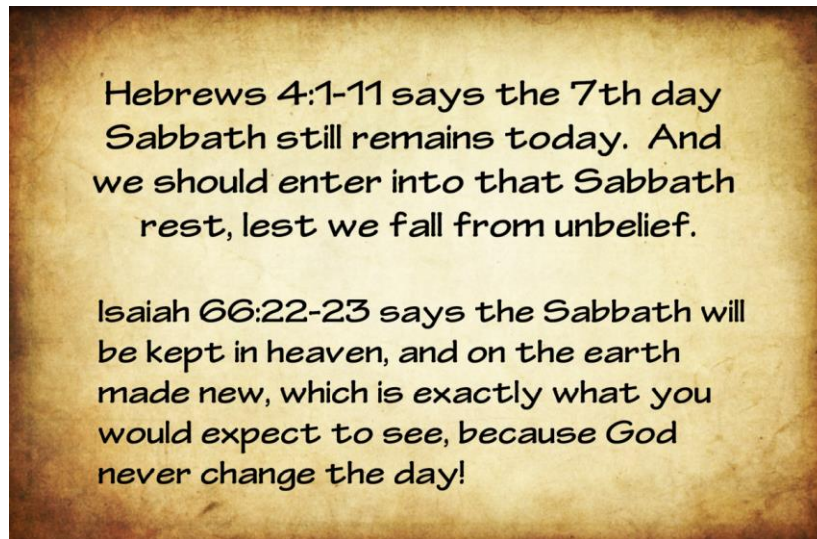
Not for the Jews

The commandment says, “Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labor, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: for in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord Blessed the Sabbath day, and hallowed it.” **Exodus 20:8-11**
